The last page says that Philip Maguire OFM, at the Irish Franciscan convent of St Isidore in Rome, was requested by the Cardinals of the Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith to prepare a second edition of Ó hEódhasa's Catechism for press and that he also revised the proofs.

Where the Antwerp printing of 1611 and the Louvain printing of [1614] disagree, this second edition tends to follow Antwerp, but new typographical errors abound. This edition adds Ó hEódhasa's poem 'Truagh liom a chompain do chor' (pp. 237–55, wanting qq. 23, 86), originally printed at Louvain around the same time as the first printing of the Catechism, but here the spelling is different, implying that it was not set from the early printing.

Four unnumbered leaves with a woodcut of the Crucifixion and the Coronation of the Virgin and an Irish rendering of the *Translatio miraculosa ecclesiae Beatae Mariae Virginis Loreto* of Pietro di Georgio Tolomei (d. 1473) (*Tosach agas Aistriugha miorbhuileach Theampoill Mhuire Loreto*) were also printed and bound with the Catechism.

Copies of this were found by J. P. Lyons in Rome (as also with 00 above); sixty-six copies appeared as a single lot at the sale of his library, 1845 Lyons 581, sold for £7-8-6 (a rate of 1/3 each), as well as two separate copies, 1845 Lyons 579, 580 (*IBL* 4 (1912), 58–9).
